We come to the final newsletter for this term, with next week being the last week. It has been a very busy term and I am sure everyone is looking forward to a well-earned break. The term will conclude with an assembly next Friday at 1:30pm.

### **Farewell**

At the end of this term, we farewell Brydie Lewis. Her family is moving to Mt Gambier and we wish her all the best at her new school.

### **Assessment and Interviews**

The interviews are currently being held and it was fantastic to see such a great response to parents committing to interviews. The mid-year interview is essential for monitoring the progress of your child/ren as we head into the second half of the year.

If, for whatever reason, you can't make the interview, your child's report will be sent home next week with an accompanying letter. The report was written with the

intention of being presented at an interview.

### **External Review**

Our external review has concluded after a rigorous two days of examination. During this time, the review panel met with the principal, leadership team, students, most of the teachers, a few parents and the Governing Council. The review panel members asked many questions and had lots of discussion around improvement and how we can make a good school even better. On the whole, the response was very positive with data representative of a high-performing school with good quality teaching methodologies and excellent community connections.

Next term, we will receive a 4 page report summarising the findings and recommendations. The key points will be put in the newsletter, with the whole document available on the website.

### **Volunteer Policy**

Earlier this week, the SAFE team conducted an audit of our child protection practices, focussing on DCSI clearances for all relevant people. A recommendation is that we need to have a volunteer policy and all volunteers will need to not only have their DCSI clearance, but have attended a Responding to Abuse and Neglect training for volunteers as well. I intend to run these courses over the next two terms so that all volunteers can be ready to go in 2016, where having both these requirements will be compulsory.

### **Bus Absences**

Can families who catch buses please let bus drivers know when you are not going to be on the bus, or there is a change of circumstances. This will help greatly to make the bus driver's run easier and keep to the timetable. If it is a school event, they will be notified, but it would be a good idea to keep them informed.

### **SAPSASA Soccer**

The MSE boys soccer team has had some tough games this week, but they finally notched up a win and a draw yesterday, which has put the boys in good spirits. We congratulate Corey Brand, James Muecke and Taj Messenger on their efforts.

### SAPSASA Hockey/State Selection

Lucy Sharman has also been in Adelaide this week representing our school and our district at the SAPSASA State Hockey Carnival.

Lucy has also won selection in both the Under 12 and Under 13 State Hockey teams. She will be off to Perth and Sydney for the two national carnivals and we know what a wonderful ambassador she will be.
