#### **NAPLAN 2023**

Our students in Years 3 and 5 will complete the NAPLAN assessments online this year (Year 3 students will complete the writing task using paper and pencil. All other tested areas will be done online). The testing will take place in Weeks 7 and 8 this term.

To prepare our students and to test our IT systems, a trial assessment will occur on Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> of February. This will involve Years 3 and 5 students completing a 45 minute practice test which will incorporate literacy and numeracy perspectives. Please be aware that an assessment report of student achievement will not be provided to families for the practice test.

For parents/caregivers of students in these year levels a privacy collection notice was sent home via Seesaw a couple of weeks ago. If you have any questions, please contact your child's classroom teacher or myself to discuss.



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#### **School Arrivals -**


Students are not to be onsite before 8:30am. We have had a number of students arriving early (8:15 am). Students will not be supervised or be the responsibility of educators before 8:30am.

### **SCHOOL INFORMATION: Parking**

Please be aware of the areas you are and are not permitted to park. The area across the road from where the buses pull up is not only inconvenient for the drivers, but also a dangerous place for children to cross. It is a **no parking zone** between **8.30 – 8.45 a.m. and 3.15 – 3.30 p.m.** We also discourage anyone from parking on the eastern side of Young Street during bus times, as shown on the accompanying map.





Please also note, that at the Koala (flashing light) crossing, drivers must not park within 20 metres of the approach to a koala crossing or within 10 metres after passing it. This is indicated with a No Stopping sign and a yellow line on the road. These road rules are in place to ensure the safety of our students.


Family & Friends Volunteer group AGM CHANGE OF DATE
