National Volunteers Week

ANZAC Day Commemorations

During the holidays, members of our SRC represented the school in laying a wreath at the ANZAC Day service in Penola. Along with this, our student choir also performed 'Waltzing Matilda' at the ceremony. While it is incredibly important to be represented at these local commemoration services such as Anzac Day, it is just as important that our students understand the significance of these days.

School Drop Off

Lately we have noticed a number of students getting dropped off well before 8:30am. A reminder that our

duty of care begins at 8:30am, with duty of care provided by a yard duty teacher. Students are to arrive between 8:30 and 8:45am, with classes beginning following our 8:45am bell.

School Uniform

With cooler weather upon us it is important to ensure that our children wear appropriate school uniform to help with regulating their body temperature. Living in the South East can mean that we see some pretty cold and rough weather from time to time, particularly in the mornings!

Our uniform dress code states:

- At Penola Primary School students are expected to wear the approved polo T-shirt, jumpers and softshell jacket which are only available for purchase from the front office. These uniform items must have the embroidered school logo.
- Blue/white checked dresses are also permitted, also available from the office.
- Navy or dark (blue or black) pants/shorts/skirts are to be worn. Winter woollen skirts can be made, please arrange via the front office. Navy tights may be worn under school dresses or skirts.

We support and understand that waterproof and thicker than usual jackets (above and beyond the normal school jumper) which may not comply with the school uniform code may be worn outside and whilst in transition to school. However, once student learning begins, students will be asked to remove these articles of clothing in the classroom.

Along with this, our SRC has raised 'beanies' as an item of clothing for students to wear during the colder months. While we do not have a school beanie, we support students wearing this item outside of the classroom.

Dogs on School Grounds

We are incredibly fortunate at Penola Primary to have Mae, our school dog onsite throughout the day. While this is great for our students, we remind our wider community that NO other dogs are permitted on school grounds at any time of the day or night. It is disappointing for staff and students to find the mess that other dogs leave behind on our school grounds on a near daily basis. We are well aware that this could also be wider community members walking their dogs through our grounds but if you normally do walk your dog through the school, could you please now walk around the grounds in the future.

Neighbourhood Kindness Challenge

As a family, choose an act of kindness from the list below that you would like to do for a neighbour or family friend. Each family member can select one to commit to, or you can choose to do one together.

- Cook them something delicious like a cake, hot bread, or cookies.
- Write a note to put in their letter box thanking them for being a great neighbour or friend.
- Design them a Thank You card.
- Pick or buy some flowers to deliver to them.
- Choose a little plant from your garden to give them.
- Make them a gift from things around your house.

- Offer to take their pets for a walk.
- Invite them over for afternoon tea.
- Invite them on a walk.
- Recommend one of your favourite books to borrow and read.
- Ask them if they need anything from the shops next time you buy groceries.

- Feel free to do more than one and spread the kindness even further!
- Report back to each other in one week and share how your acts of kindness were received, and how doing them made you feel.

Every night at dinner, have each person thank another family member for something


they've done or said today, or give another family member a compliment.





Year 6

The year 6 class is building and programming with the recently-purchased Spike Prime kits.












STEM

This class has to design a car that will travel the furthest down a ramp. They have been using 'Tinkercad' to design their car bodies and will then 3D print them and add an axle and wheels.








SCHOOL EVENTS: Anzac Day
