Hi Families,

#### **External School Review**

In Week 4, we completed our two day school review. This involved a review officer and a current principal spending the day here interviewing students, teachers, SSOs and parents, as well as walking through classes and finding out about the great things we do as a school and as a learning community. The days went extremely well, with the review team meeting with the teaching staff at the end of the day one to do an activity and then debriefing with the leadership team about our strengths and potential next steps at the end of day two. In the coming weeks, we will receive our formal feedback document that we will share with staff and Governing Council, before sharing our schools future 'directions' with our students and families. Thank you to all of our community members who were involved in the review and a special mention to many of our year 3-6 students who were interviewed over the two days and spoke extremely well about their learning and leadership opportunities within our school.

The purpose of these meetings is for your child to share their learning, to discuss their goals for the second half of the year, and to discuss their current progress. #### Gratitude

Practising gratitude is the ability to notice things in your life (big and small) and appreciate them, rather than thinking about the things you wish you had, or might be missing out on. Making this a daily habit rewires your brain to scan the world for the positives rather than default to our negative bias. Over time, this leads to increased levels of energy, happiness, and self-esteem.

#### You Will Need

- · Get your family together.
- Paper for each player.
- Pencil/pen for each player.

#### How To Play

- This game can be played individually or in teams.
- Choose a letter of the alphabet at random (you might use an alphabet chart, sing the alphabet song, put all the letters of the alphabet in a container like a raffle or you might have a letter dice at home).
- In that one minute, each player/team writes down as many things they can that they are grateful for starting with that letter.
- · Winning player/team scores a point.
- · Play again with a different letter.
- Play continues for as long as you like.
- Winner is the player/team who has the most points at the end of your game.

## **SCHOOL NEWS: National Simultaneous Story time**





Last week we participated in the National Simultaneous Story Time and we listened to the book, 'The Speedy Sloth', which was read by the author, Rebecca Young. We shared this experience with 2.3 million people all listening at the same time. At the end of the story, the illustrator, Heath McKenzie showed us all how to draw a sloth. Our 2/3B class has also drawn a beautiful array of sloths and they can be found in our front office foyer. The students enjoyed participating in this wonderful experience.



## **Reading Fluency Pairs**

This term both Year 2/3 Classes have been working on improving their fluency when reading. The classes have had a focus on phrasing when reading. The children read aloud daily to their partner. Reading aloud allows the reader to read clearly and at an appropriate pace, paying attention to punctuation.

The reading session starts with reading non-words. Non-words are not real word, but they can be made up of single letter sounds, digraphs, blends and/or other sound patterns that make up real words. The next phase is to



read regular words (or words known as tricky words). After this the partners have been taking turns to read fluency passages and 'good fit' reading texts.

The pairs have been working productively during reading sessions. They have been concentrating on their individual reading goals. It has been fantastic to see the children giving specific and directed feedback to their partner.













## Cultural Learning in the Year 2/3 Classes



On Tuesday 6th June, Karly and Harvey, invited their neighbour, Hoa to come into school and talk to the classes about living and growing up in Vietnam. Hoa was very organised and came with a PowerPoint sharing cultural pictures and information about Vietnam. She then gave the students special paper to make an origami tulip and then an envelope and card so they children could make a money bag, which is handed out at the Tet Festivial (Lunar New Year). We then tasted some spring rolls and money bags dipped in sweet chilli sauce.

She even had some quiz questions to ask students at the end.

As a parting gift, Hoa gave each of the students some origami paper to take home and make with.

Thank you Hoa for coming in and sharing with us your culture. We enjoyed having you in the classroom and appreciate your kindness and generosity in the resources you shared with us.



## **SCHOOL NEWS: Japanese and Drama**

Students across the school have been busy in their specialist subjects this term. In Japanese, the 2/3s have been learning vocabulary for body parts while conducting surveys, singing songs and playing a Japanese version of 'Pin the tail on the donkey', called *Fukuwarai* which means fun smile! Meanwhile, the F/1s have been crosshatching with coloured pencils and mixing watercolour paint, using Japanese words to identify both colours and animals. Year 4/5s have been working on the Riceball Rap, while in Year 6, students are writing and reading self-introductions while using mnemonics and games to aid their memorization of hiragana characters.




















## **SCHOOL NEWS: Environment Group**
