Breakfast Club

We have started Breakfast Club at school which runs every Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday from 8:30am—8:50am in the canteen. Every student can access toast and fruit in the morning and there is no charge for this service. We are very fortunate to be supported by Mardi and Geoff Currie from Windara Bakery who are supplying all of the bread (and a freezer for storage!) and Foodbank in Mt Gambier who are providing fruit and spreads, as well as other items we will introduce in the future. Children have growing bodies and growing minds and there are lots of reasons why children may be hungry in the morning. Regardless of the reasons, we have the opportunity to provide this service to our students and support them in their learning and well-being. There are many benefits to running a program like this. These include;

- Building a sense of community in the school
- Bringing children together and helping them to meet people
- Students engaging in class a lot better with a full stomach
- Students demonstrating greater persistence and resilience for learning
- Improvements to learning, attention span and behaviour
- Breakfast becoming a familiar routine that students follow on these mornings. Having a consistent routine is important to ensuring positive student wellbeing
- Providing a safe environment and keeping students focused
- Improving student attendance at school

Mathematics in Year 2/3A

The Year 2/3 A class has been developing their understanding of numbers, specifically learning more about place value.


They have been working on writing, recognising and ordering 2, 3 and 4 digit numbers. The class has been learning more about our Base 10 Number System, which uses the digits 0, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 to make all numbers. They are developing an understanding of the importance of zero, and that zero's special role is as a placeholder.


The students have been working diligently to construct, represent and record numbers in collections.


The focus has been on:

- Counting collections
- Using efficient counting strategies (tally marks, grouping by 10s and 100s)
- Grouping collections into ones, tens, hundreds and thousands (place value knowledge)
- Representing numbers using pictures, expanding numbers (number sentence) and displaying on a place value chart
- Expanding numbers using place value knowledge (134 is 100 + 30 +
 4)
- Renaming numbers using place value knowledge (134 is also 13 tens
 and 4 ones, 134 is also 1 hundred and 34 ones)
- Rearranging numbers and working flexibly with numbers (134 can be made multiple ways e.g. 100 + 10 + 10 + 4 or 100 + 20 + 10 + 2 + 2)


