Hi Families,

As another term is drawing to a close, it is fantastic to walk through our school and see the amazing learning opportunities our students are accessing. The students explain to me what they are doing (Learning Intentions) and telling me how they are going to be successful (Success Criteria). Last week we had Shane Crawford (facilitator for our site in Professional Development) visit our site and he was also incredibly impressed with how well our students could articulate this to him. This really highlights the work our teaching staff are putting in and this is proving to be successful in supporting our students learning and understanding.

Right to Disconnect – Staff Communication

This is a new clause in the enterprise agreement that outlines the department's commitment to minimise digital communication with teachers to ensure an appropriate work/life balance is met, while accommodating a school's operational needs. This new clause confirms that, other than in exceptional circumstances, teachers are encouraged to disconnect from digital technologies and communications while taking rest time, weekends and leave.

As a leader, and in consultation with our Governing Council, while we appreciate the strong communication technology provides between our teachers and families, we also recognise that this transformation in connectivity is a factor contributing to the ever increasing teacher workload.

To recognise this, attached to this newsletter is a letter from our Governing Council Chairperson, Matt McGregor, and myself, that outlines our communication processes and the expectations of our teachers in line with the new enterprise agreement. Gratitude

Some benefits of practising gratitude are:

- After 21 days, you start to scan the world for positives.
- After 42 days you become:
- More optimistic, energised & focused.
- Less likely to get sick.
- You will sleep better.
- Anxiety and depression decreases.

A few quick and simple ways to practise being grateful are:

- Journaling; each night write down 3 things that went well for you that day or purchase a gratitude journal with gratitude prompts.
- Write a gratitude letter to someone special, telling them why you are grateful they are in your life.
- Have a family discussion on the way home from school or around the dinner table about the things that went well that day or made you smile.

Lions Mad Minute

Dear Families,

We value the positive relationship that exists between parents and our school community because we know that this goes hand in hand with student wellbeing and academic achievement.

The availability of digital platforms including **Seesaw and Facebook** have made it easier than ever for us to provide information to you in a timely manner and allow you to seek clarity and provide information to us in return.

However, reliance on digital platforms as the main point of contact with the school has created a situation where our teachers appear more accessible at times of the day when they are teaching and developing learning materials for their classes, and during non-work time when they should be disconnected from work.

The purpose of this letter is to let you know that while staff will continue to respond to your messages as soon as practicable, the Department, the Governing Council, and I as site leader, do not expect them to respond to non-urgent communication in their personal time.

To ensure our staff can focus on their duties, our school will be implementing the following approach to staff-directed communications.

Routine contact:

- 1. Parents should contact us **via the front office on 87372300** and leave a message for the relevant staff member to contact them.
- 2. **Seesaw messages and emails** sent directly to a teacher or support staff member will be responded to within 2-3 working days **and within school hours**.
- 3. Should a return call/message not be received within 2-3 working days, parents may further contact us via **the front office on 87372300**.

Urgent contact:

- Parents should make contact via the front office on 87372300 leaving a message flagging the matter as urgent.
- 2. A member of the leadership team will **determine who is the best person to respond to the matter** and do so as a matter of priority.


